I BELIEVE THE LIBRARY IS THE GREAT EQUALIZER WHERE EVERYONE CAN COME TOGETHER, ACCESS RESOURCES, AND FIND FELLOWSHIP WITHIN THEIR COMMUNITY. REGARDLESS OF YOUR RACE, GENDER IDENTITY, SEXUAL ORIENTATION, SOCIOECONOMIC CLASS, OR HOUSING STATUS, YOU CAN COME INTO THE PUBLIC LIBRARY TO ACCESS EDUCATIONAL RESOURCES,

TECHNOLOGY, ENTERTAINMENT, OR SIMPLY FIND A COOL PLACE TO SIT IN THESE 90 DEGREE DAYS.

LOOKING AROUND THE LIBRARY, WE ARE PROUD TO SEE SO MUCH DIVERSITY. LAST JUNE, THIS COMMISSION MADE AN APPOINTMENT TO THIS LIBRARY BOARD. THE TRUSTEE THAT WAS APPOINTED AT THAT TIME HAS SINCE MADE REMARKS IN BOARD MEETING, ADVOCATION TO, AND I QUOTE FROM THE MEETING MINUTES, DO MORE TO DISCRIMINATE AGAINST THE HOMELESS. I ASK THIS COMMISSION WHEN HAS DISCRIMINATING MORE EVER BEEN ON THE RIGHT SIDE OF HISTORY? WHAT THIS APPOINTED TRUSTEE IS ADVOCATING FOR ISN'T JUST ILLEGAL HERE IN THE STATE OF MICHIGAN.

I DON'T FEEL IT REPRESENTS THE BELIEFS OR WANTS OF OUR COMMUNITY WHO USE THE LIBRARY. ACCORDING TO A PRESENTATION I RECENTLY RECEIVED FROM THE MCKINNEY-VENTO PROGRAM, BAY COUNTY HAS OVER 300 HOMELESS CHILDREN. WHEN WE TALK ABOUT PROHIBITING ACCESS FROM ENTRY, BASED ON HOUSING STATUS, WE ARE TALKING ABOUT 300 BAY COUNTY CHILDREN. A CANDIDATE THAT YOU WILL VOTE ON TODAY, MS. JACKSON, HAS SHARED THESE TROUBLING SENTIMENTS ADVOCATING FOR DISCRIMINATION OF UNHOUSED PERSONS. I URGE YOU TO REPRESENT THE BEST INTERESTS OF THIS COMMUNITY TODAY AND MAINTAIN THE INTEGRITY OF THE LIBRARY BY REAPPOINTING MR. TRAVIS TO THE LIBRARY BOARD.

MR. DAY:

I LOVE THAT THE LIBRARY IS A PLACE FOR EVERYBODY. THAT'S WHY I THINK MR. TRAVIS SHOULD BE REELECTED.

MS. HOERAUF:

A YEAR AGO, I STOOD IN FRONT OF YOU AS A CANDIDATE FOR THE BAY COUNTY LIBRARY BOARD. AT THAT TIME, YOU CHOSE TO APPOINT DOUG STONE AND SINCE HIS APPOINTMENT I HAVE BEEN TROUBLED BY THE DISCRIMINATORY STATEMENTS THAT HE'S MADE ABOUT THE UNHOUSED PEOPLE IN OUR COMMUNITY. YOU HAVE ANOTHER LIBRARY APPOINTMENT BEFORE YOU TODAY. IN PREPARATION, I WENT BACK AND REVIEWED THE REQUIREMENTS FOR THE POSITION. BOARD MEMBERS ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR SERVING AS CONNECTING LINKS BETWEEN THE LIBRARY AND THE COMMUNITY AND BEING ADVOCATES FOR THE LIBRARY. THE AMERICAN LIBRARY ASSOCIATION ETHICS STATEMENT, WHICH THIS BOARD ADHERES TO, STATES THAT BOARD MEMBERS MUST DISTINGUISH CLEARLY IN THEIR ACTIONS AND STATEMENTS BETWEEN PERSONAL PHILOSOPHIES AND ATTITUDES AND THOSE OF THE INSTITUTION.

I'M ESPECIALLY CONCERNED WITH THE CANDIDATE, MS. JACKSON. I DO NOT KNOW MS. JACKSON PERSONALLY, BUT I'VE READ HER VIEWS OF THE LIBRARY BOARD ON FACEBOOK, WHICH ARE VERY CONCERNING TO ME SINCE IT'S A PUBLIC FORUM AND OUT THERE FOR EVERYONE TO SEE. SHE STATED THAT THE WORD ON THE STREET IS THAT THE LIBRARY SPENDS THE CRAP OUT OF YOUR MONEY ON STUPID (EXPLETIVE). THE CURRENT BOARD HAS VERY LIBERAL SPENDERS WHO DROP THOUSANDS ON DUMB (EXPLETIVE). SHE WENT ON TO DISPARAGE UNHOUSED PEOPLE. SAYING THEY NEED TO STAY OUT OF THE LIBRARY. SHE SUMMED UP HER POST BY SAYING, "MY GOAL, IF I JOIN ANY GROUP, IS NOT TO CARE ABOUT ANYBODY'S FEELINGS OR OFFENDING ANYONE". THIS IS NOT A PERSON WHO IS COMMITTED TO BEING A LINK BETWEEN THE LIBRARY AND THE COMMUNITY, OR WHO UNDERSTANDS THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS BOARD POSITION. I URGE YOU TO VOTE FOR PAUL TRAVIS TO BE REAPPOINTED.

MS. STROHKIRCH: THE BAY COUNTY LIBRARY SYSTEM IS A TRUE GEM IN OUR COMMUNITIES THROUGHOUT BAY COUNTY. I REVIEWED THE MOST RECENT FOUR MONTHS OF MINUTES OF THE LIBRARY BOARD OF TRUSTEES. I GIVE KUDOS TO MS. BURNS AND MR. AYALA FOR THEIR STEWARDSHIP OF THE LIBRARY AND THEIR TRANSPARENCY TO THE LIBRARY BOARD OF TRUSTEES. WE ARE TRULY FORTUNATE TO HAVE THEM AT THE HELM.

> MY CONCERNS STEM FROM SOME STATEMENTS MADE BY A CURRENT TRUSTEE AND ONE THAT IS ECHOED BY A CURRENT BOARD-APPOINTED NOMINEE, MY FIRST CONCERN IS THAT MR. STONE STATES THAT HE IS NOT IN POSSESSION AND OR FAMILIAR WITH THE BAY COUNTY DISTRICT LIBRARY BYLAWS. HE ASKED FOR THEM AT THE LAST MEETING, THESE BYLAWS ARE READILY AVAILABLE ON THE DISTRICT WEBSITE AND ARE THE GOVERNING DOCUMENT THAT THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES SHOULD BE USING TO GUIDE THEIR COLLECTIVE ACTIONS. HE ALSO STATED THAT HE WAS IN NEED OF ROBERT'S RULES OF ORDER, THE GUIDING PROCESS FOR THE BYLAWS. THIS REFERENCE IS AVAILABLE AT EVERY BAY COUNTY PUBLIC LIBRARY IN THE REFERENCE SECTION. MY SECOND CONCERN IS THE STATEMENTS MADE IN THE MOST RECENT MEETING BY MR. STONE AND THOSE ECHOED IN A SOCIAL MEDIA POST THAT WAS SHARED. THESE STATEMENTS CONCERNED LIMITING ACCESS TO NON-BAY COUNTY RESIDENTS DUE TO NOT PAYING TAXES, BUT THE PRIMARY CONCERN WAS RAISED DUE TO PATRONS BEING UNHOUSED. PER THE MICHIGAN PUBLIC LIBRARY TRUSTEE MANUAL, WHICH I FOUND ON THE LIBRARY OF MICHIGAN WEBSITE, MICHIGAN GRANTS ITS

CITIZENS A CONSTITUTIONAL RIGHT TO ACCESS LIBRARY SERVICES. ARTICLE 8, SECTION 9 IN THE CONSTITUTION STATES, LEGISLATURE SHALL THAT THE PROVIDE FOR ESTABLISHMENT AND SUPPORT OF PUBLIC LIBRARIES WHICH SHALL BE AVAILABLE TO ALL RESIDENTS OF THE STATE UNDER REGULATIONS ADOPTED BY THE GOVERNING BODIES THEREOF. THIS DOES NOT MEAN THAT THE TRUSTEES AS A GOVERNING BODY CANNOT MAKE POLICIES AND REQUIREMENTS, BUT THEY SHOULD CONSIDER THE FOLLOWING WHEN DOING SO. DOES THE POLICY COMPLY WITH CURRENT STATUTES? IS THE POLICY REASONABLE, INCLUDING REASONABLE PENALTIES? COULD THERE BE A DISCRIMINATORY APPLICATION TO THE POLICY AND IS THE POLICY MEASURABLE?

OUR LIBRARY DISTRICT DOES CURRENTLY HAVE A NO-SLEEPING POLICY THAT I WOULD ENCOURAGE YOU, THE COMMISSIONERS, TO ASK THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES TO RECONSIDER AND HAVE THEM REVIEWED BY LEGAL COUNSEL. I CIRCLE BACK TO MY ORIGINAL QUESTION OF WHAT TRAINING AND EDUCATION IS PROVIDED TO TRUSTEES ONCE APPOINTED TO ENSURE THAT THEY ARE COMPLIANT WITH THE STATUTES IN THE STATE CONSTITUTION, WHICH UPON THEIR APPOINTMENT THEY TAKE AN OATH TO UPHOLD.

THE LAST CONCERN I WOULD LIKE TO ADDRESS IS THE POLICY OF CHECKING PATRONS' RESIDENCY FOR ENTRY TO THE LIBRARIES. IT NOT ONLY VIOLATES THE STATE CONSTITUTION, BUT ALSO DISCRIMINATES AGAINST WOMEN AND CHILDREN RESIDING AT LOCAL DOMESTIC VIOLENCE SHELTERS, OR THOSE UTILIZING THE PROTECTION OF THEIR ADDRESS CONFIDENTIALITY ACT. WOMEN AND CHILDREN UTILIZING THE SERVICES OF DOMESTIC VIOLENCE SHELTERS OR TRANSITIONAL HOUSING ARE CONSIDERED HOMELESS. THEY ARE OFTEN NOT ALLOWED TO USE THE TEMPORARY HOUSING ADDRESS ON THEIR IDENTIFYING DOCUMENTS.

I ENCOURAGE THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS TO APPOINT MR. TRAVIS TO THE LIBRARY BOARD OF TRUSTEES FOR A SECOND TERM.

MS. BARCIA:

THERE HAVE BEEN TROUBLING COMMENTS MADE ADVOCATING FOR DISCRIMINATION AGAINST HOMELESS INDIVIDUALS ACCESSING OUR PUBLIC LIBRARY. AS A MEMBER OF THIS COMMUNITY I AM DEEPLY DISAPPOINTED BY THESE SENTIMENTS, ESPECIALLY FROM INDIVIDUALS WHO HOLD OR SEEK POSITIONS OF INFLUENCE SUCH AS THE BAY COUNTY LIBRARY BOARD. OUR

PUBLIC LIBRARY SHOULD BE A SANCTUARY FOR ALL RESIDENTS, REGARDLESS OF THEIR BACKGROUND OR CIRCUMSTANCE. IT IS A PLACE WHERE EVERYONE SHOULD FEEL SAFE, WELCOMED AND VALUED. DENYING ACCESS TO HOMELESS INDIVIDUALS CONTRADICTS THESE FUNDAMENTAL PRINCIPLES OF INCLUSIVITY AND COMPASSION. IT IS OUR DUTY AS COMMUNITY MEMBERS TO STAND UP FOR THOSE WHO MAY NOT HAVE A VOICE TO ADVOCATE FOR FAIRNESS AND EQUALITY AND TO ENSURE THAT ALL RESIDENTS OF BAY COUNTY FEEL RESPECTED AND EMBRACED. DISCRIMINATION HAS NO PLACE IN OUR COMMUNITY

AND WE MUST ACTIVELY WORK TO CREATE AN ENVIRONMENT WHERE EVERY INDIVIDUAL FEELS CELEBRATED AND SUPPORTED.

MS. GUTIERREZ:

I AM REPRESENTING DO ALL, INC. WHERE I SERVE AS PRESIDENT AND CEO. OUR NON-PROFIT IS DEDICATED TO EMPOWERING INDIVIDUALS LIVING WITH DISABILITIES AND THOSE FACING ENHANCING INCLUSIVE OPPORTUNITIES BARRIERS. EMPLOYMENT AND COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT. I STAND BEFORE YOU TO EMPHASIZE THE CRITICAL IMPORTANCE OF EQUAL ACCESS TO OUR LOCAL LIBRARIES FOR ALL MEMBERS OF OUR COMMUNITY. FOR THE INDIVIDUALS THAT DO ALL, INC. SERVES, THE LIBRARY IS NOT JUST A PLACE TO BORROW BOOKS, IT IS A LIFELINE. IT IS A PLACE WHERE CLIENTS CAN ACCESS THE INTERNET TO FIND JOB POSTINGS, CREATE RESUMES, TAKE PART IN COMMUNITY EVENTS AND WORKSHOPS, CONNECT WITH THEIR SUPPORT NETWORK AND OTHER HELPING PROFESSIONALS, ALL WHILE IN A SAFE AND INTEGRATED COMMUNITY ENVIRONMENT, REGARDLESS OF THEIR HOUSING STATUS.

THE IMPACT ON INDIVIDUALS IF THEY WERE DENIED ACCESS TO THE LIBRARY BASED ON THEIR HOUSING STATUS, DISABILITY, MENTAL HEALTH DIAGNOSIS, OR OTHER FACTORS WOULD MEAN CUTTING OFF A VITAL RESOURCE THAT HELPS FOLKS NAVIGATE THE CHALLENGES THEY FACE WHILE THEY STRIVE FOR INDEPENDENCE AND SELF-SUFFICIENCY.

I IMPLORE YOU TO FIGHT ACTIVELY AGAINST AND OPPOSE DISCRIMINATION OF ANY KIND IN OUR LIBRARY AND OUR GREATER COMMUNITY.

MR. TRAVIS:

I AM PLEASED TO HAVE THE OPPORTUNITY TO SPEAK ON MY BEHALF TOWARD GETTING A REAPPOINTMENT. I RAN INTO ONE OF OUR WONDERFUL STAFF MEMBERS AT THE LIBRARY WHO OVERSEES OUR CHILDREN'S PROGRAMS. I NEVER IMAGINED HOW MANY THERE WERE UNTIL I GOT THE MONTHLY REPORTS FROM OUR EXCELLENT LIBRARY MANAGERS. SHE WAS TELLING ME

ABOUT THE OVERWHELMING RESPONSE FOR THE SUMMER READING PROGRAM. WHAT A GREAT THING AS A RETIRED ELEMENTARY PRINCIPAL, PREVIOUS TO THAT A TEACHER, THE FACT THAT WE HAVE KIDS IN THIS WORLD OF ALL THE IPHONES AND IPADS, WE STILL HAVE KIDS READING. I'M JUST SO EXCITED TO BE PART OF THAT. THE LEADERSHIP AMONGST OUR STAFF IS JUST AMAZING, FROM TRISH AND KEVIN, OUR DIRECTOR AND ASSISTANT, IT'S JUST A REMARKABLE ORGANIZATION. I HOPE YOU GIVE ME A CHANCE TO CONTINUE MY ROLE AS A TRUSTEE ON THE LIBRARY BOARD.

MS. JACKSON:

THIS IS MY FIRST TIME EVER DOING ANYTHING LIKE THIS. WOW, HAS IT BEEN A LEARNING EXPERIENCE. IT'S HOW YOU REACT TO THOSE OPINIONS. THAT'S WHAT'S GREAT ABOUT AMERICA. EVERYBODY HAS A DIFFERENT OPINION BUT IT'S HOW YOU HANDLE IT.

I LOVE THE LIBRARY. I WAS THERE TODAY. I WAS TELLING THIS WOMAN TODAY ABOUT THE GREAT PROGRAM THEY GAVE WITH LUNCH TODAY. THEY GAVE OUT BOOKS. I HAVE AMAZING THINGS TO SAY ABOUT EVERY CHILDREN'S PROGRAM THAT THE LIBRARY HAS. SO PLEASE DON'T GET ME WRONG AND THINK THAT I'M AGAINST ANYTHING. THE HOMELESS PEOPLE HAVE EVERY RIGHT TO THE LIBRARY. THEY CAN BE THERE LOOKING FOR JOBS, USING THE COMPUTER TO APPLY FOR JOBS, FINDING KNOWLEDGE IN WHATEVER THEY NEED TO DO. WHAT I HAD A CONCERN WITH AS A PARENT AND BASED ON WHAT I HAD READ FROM DOUG STONE IS PEOPLE, NOT JUST HOMELESS, ANY ADULT WASHING THEMSELVES IN A PUBLIC BATHROOM THAT KIDS CAN GO INTO. AS FAR AS ANYTHING ABOUT ME HATING THE HOMELESS, THAT IS 100% NOT TRUE AND WAS TAKEN OUT OF CONTEXT.

MS. FALON:

I HEARD THAT 300 CHILDREN ARE HOMELESS. MY HEART DROPS. I'M A FORMER EDUCATOR AND THINK THAT THESE KIDS MIGHT HAVE TO WASH UP IN THE BATHROOM. THANK YOU, BAY CITY LIBRARY, FOR NOT KICKING THEM OUT BECAUSE NOW THEY CAN GET A LITTLE BIT CLEAN. THANK YOU FOR LETTING THEM BRUSH THEIR TEETH. BUT TO COME INTO A PUBLIC PLACE, IT'S OKAY. THEY DISINFECT THE BATHROOMS ALL THE TIME. IT'S NOT A BIG DEAL. WE CAN MAKE IT A BIG DEAL IF WE WANT AND DISCRIMINATE AGAINST THE UNHOUSED. I WANT YOU TO LOOK AROUND THIS ROOM. AT SOME POINT ONE OF US MIGHT BE UNHOUSED. THINGS HAPPEN IN OUR LIVES THAT ARE UNEXPECTED, ILLNESS, DIVORCE, DEATH. WE MUST HAVE

ACCEPTANCE OF EVERYBODY. I HOPE THE LIBRARY WILL APPOINT SOMEONE LIKE MR. TRAVIS.

MR. POIRIER:

I WANTED TO TAKE A MOMENT TO COME UP HERE AND THANK EVERY ONE OF YOU FOR THE TIME YOU GUYS SPENT WITH MY GRANDFATHER. HE ENJOYED SERVING ON THIS COMMISSION. THANK YOU FOR YOUR COMMUNITY SUPPORT AND EVERYTHING THAT YOU GUYS HAVE DONE FOR HIM IN THE LAST YEAR THAT HE SERVED WITH YOU GUYS.

PETITIONS AND COMMUNICATIONS

MR. PINTER:

SINCE THE PUBLIC HEALTH EMERGENCY STARTED PHASING OUT BACK IN LATE 2022, WE'VE SEEN PROBABLY A 50% INCREASE IN SERVICE DEMAND IN THE LAST TWO YEARS. THAT'S INCREDIBLE. WE'RE NOW PAST OUR PRE-COVID SERVICE REQUEST, AND A LOT OF THAT HAS BEEN INPATIENT. I WOULD SAY PROBABLY WE SPEND 40% MORE NOW ON INPATIENT THAN WE DID BACK IN 2019. WE ALSO HAVE A DEMAND NOW FOR OUTPATIENT.

WE HAVE REPURPOSED THE MULHOLLAND CAMPUS THAT WAS PURCHASED BY THE COUNTY. IT WAS A GRANT ARRANGED BY THE COUNTY AND BY BAY MEDICAL CENTER IN 1975. WE ARE DOING OUTPATIENT THERAPY THERE AGAIN.

WE RECOGNIZED THERE'S A LOT MORE AWARENESS SINCE COVID-19 OF THE IMPORTANCE OF SOCIAL CONNECTIONS AND MENTAL HEALTH WELLNESS IN THE GENERAL COMMUNITY. WE HAVE BEEN TRYING TO GET PEOPLE INTO ENGAGEMENT GROUPS AND GROUPS AROUND EMOTIONAL REGULATION AND DIFFERENT THINGS THAT THE GENERAL PUBLIC IS NOT AWARE OF POSTCOVID.

MOST PEOPLE HAVE INSURANCE AND WE DON'T HAVE ENOUGH MENTAL HEALTH PROVIDERS IN MICHIGAN. WE ARE TRYING TO FIND OTHER WAYS TO MEET THE NEEDS OF BAY COUNTY.

SOON WE WILL HAVE A CRISIS RESIDENTIAL FACILITY. THIS WILL GIVE US A PLACE TO MOVE SOME INPATIENT SERVICES.

WE ARE LOOKING AT POSSIBLY EXPANDING PEDIATRIC INPATIENT BEDS IN BAY COUNTY. THERE SOME GRANT MONEY MADE AVAILABLE THROUGH THE STATE BUDGET. WE ARE MEETING WITH MCCLAREN TO SEE IF THEY WOULD COMMIT TO ADDING CHILDREN'S BEDS TO THEIR CAMPUS.

TODAY I AM ASKING YOU TO CONSIDER A RESOLUTION BECAUSE MY BOARD HAS REACHED A POINT WITH OUR RELATIONSHIP WITH THE STATE OF MICHIGAN NOT THE ADMINISTRATION, NOT THE LEGISLATURE BUT WITH THE STATE OF MICHIGAN IN TERMS OF OUR MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES AND THEY HAVE TAKEN AN ADVERSARIAL POSITION WITH US THE LAST FOUR OR FIVE YEARS.

THE DEPARTMENT HAS TAKEN A POSITION NOW THAT THE COUNTIES HAVE BEEN PARTNERS FOR 61 YEARS WITH THE STATE PROVIDING A PUBLIC MENTAL HEALTH SYSTEM. THAT'S A SAFETY NET SYSTEM FOR PEOPLE WHO WOULD HAVE BEEN IN CARO REGIONAL CENTER, WOULD HAVE BEEN IN TRAVERSE CITY STATE HOSPITAL, WOULD HAVE BEEN IN MOUNT PLEASANT, WOULD HAVE BEEN IN KALAMAZOO.

WE COULD PROVIDE TREATMENT IN THE COMMUNITY AND GET THEM BACK TO THEIR FAMILIES. THAT'S BEEN OUR POLICY SINCE '63 WHEN BAY COUNTY WAS ONE OF THE FIRST NINE COUNTIES IN MICHIGAN TO CREATE A COUNTY MENTAL HEALTH PROGRAM.

WE ARE A SLIDING SCALE FEE-FOR-SERVICE PROGRAM. WE ARE NOT IN BUSINESS TO MAKE A PROFIT. I AM ASKING YOU TO CONSIDER PASSING THIS RESOLUTION.

COMM. BEGICK:

LOCAL CONTROL WAS A BIG ISSUE ABOUT THE STATE TAKING OVER. I HEAR THINGS ABOUT EGLE DOING THINGS WITHOUT ANY GOVERNMENTAL OVERSIGHT. I SEE A LOT OF THINGS DRIFTING THAT WAY. THE STATE HAS TAKEN OVER OUR CONTROL OF THINGS AND I DON'T THINK WE SHOULD ALLOW THAT TO HAPPEN.

MR. BARCIA:

THANK YOU FOR YOUR PRESENTATION. WE HAVE SEEN A SPIKE IN THE NEED FOR AND DEMAND FOR MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES. DO YOU THINK IT WAS EXACERBATED BY THE PANDEMIC?

MR. PINTER:

ESPECIALLY THE ISOLATION OF SOME OF THE STUDENTS AND SOME OF THE OTHER FOLKS WORKING REMOTELY AND NOT INTERACTING WITH THEIR PEERS AND THEIR COLLEAGUES. PEOPLE ARE EDUCATED ABOUT WELLNESS NOW AND ABOUT MENTAL HEALTH WELLNESS IN PARTICULAR. MORE PEOPLE ARE COMING IN ASKING FOR HELP WITH ENGAGEMENT AND HELP

WITH DEALING WITH TRAUMA. TRAUMA IS ANOTHER THING THAT 10 YEARS AGO THE GENERAL PUBLIC DIDN'T TALK ABOUT.

COMM. BANASZAK: IN BANGOR WE HAD PRETTY MUCH A SIMILAR THING. WE HAD

APPLICANTS AND WE ASKED THREE QUESTIONS EACH. WE CAN ASK REGARDING THEIR STATS ON THE COUNTY BUSINESS IF WE WANT. THE ONES WHO RAN, WE ASK THEM, YOU CANNOT BE A CANDIDATE FOR THE FALL OR THE ELECTION. YOU CANNOT BE RUNNING FOR THE OFFICE IF YOU WANT TO FILL THIS TERM. THE

ONES WE APPOINTED WERE NOT RUNNING.

MS. JOHNSON: JUST A POINT OF ORDER. YOU CAN'T RESTRICT SOMEONE FROM

APPLYING FOR AN APPOINTMENT. THE REQUIREMENTS TO APPLY FOR THE POSITION ARE THE REQUIREMENTS TO HOLD THE POSITION. YOU CAN DECIDE NOT TO VOTE FOR THAT PERSON BASED ON THAT AS A PERSONAL CHOICE. BUT THE COMMISSIONERS CAN'T STATE THAT SOMEONE CAN NOT APPLY

FOR THE POSITION IF THEY'RE GOING TO BE RUNNING.

COMM. MAILLETTE: WE HAVE THE ABILITY TO CALL INDIVIDUAL APPLICANTS BEFORE

VOTING TO ASK QUESTIONS. I DON'T THINK WE NEED TO PUT THE

CANDIDATES THROUGH INTERVIEWS.

MS. JOHNSON: I DO WANT TO MENTION THAT THERE ARE OPEN MEETING ACT

CONCERNS IF YOU ARE INTERVIEWING CANDIDATES FOR A POSITION OUTSIDE OF AN OPEN MEETING. EVEN IF IT'S JUST ONE COMMISSIONER, THERE ARE TWO CASES. ONE IS FROM THE

1990S.

THEY WERE ATTEMPTING TO HIRE SOMEONE AND THEY HAD DIFFERENT REPRESENTATIVES OF THE BOARD INTERVIEW

CANDIDATES. BECAUSE IT WASN'T DONE IN AN OPEN MEETING, IT WAS CONSIDERED A VIOLATION OF THE OPEN MEETINGS ACT. I WOULD SUGGEST THAT YOU PUT OUT AN APPLICATION AND HAVE PEOPLE SUBMIT THEIR ANSWERS IN AN APPLICATION IF THERE ARE CERTAIN QUESTIONS THAT YOU WANT THEM TO ANSWER AND YOU DON'T WANT TO GO THROUGH AN INTERVIEW PROCESS. OR YOU CAN HAVE OPEN INTERVIEWS. I WOULD ENCOURAGE COMMISSIONERS NOT TO CONTACT APPLICANTS AND HAVE DISCUSSIONS ON THE SIDE DIRECTLY. IT COULD POTENTIALLY BE CONSIDERED A VIOLATION OF THE OPEN MEETINGS ACT BECAUSE IT IS AN INTERVIEW THAT IS NOT OPEN TO THE PUBLIC.

COMM. BEGICK:

WE COULD ASK COMMISSIONERS TO SUBMIT QUESTIONS THAT WE CAN PUT ON THE APPLICATION FORM.

COMM. MAILLETTE: IS THERE SOMETHING PRE-REGISTERED? DO YOU HAVE A QUESTIONNAIRE TYPE OF THING THAT WENT OUT IN THE PAST?

MS. JOHNSON:

WE HAVE A STANDARD APPLICATION FORM THAT PEOPLE CAN SUBMIT. WE CAN ATTACH TO THAT CERTAIN QUESTIONS THAT THEY CAN ANSWER WITH THEIR APPLICATION. THE BOARD NEEDS TO DECIDE HOW MANY QUESTIONS THEY WANT TO ASK AND WHAT THOSE OUESTIONS ARE.

WHAT YOU CAN DO WITHOUT HAVING ANOTHER OPEN MEETING SO WE DON'T VIOLATE ANY OF THOSE RULES IS EVERYONE CAN SUBMIT QUESTIONS THAT THEY WOULD LIKE TO ASK. IT CAN BE SUBMITTED TO THE BOARD COORDINATOR. THE BOARD COORDINATOR CAN SEND OUT THAT LIST OF QUESTIONS AND ASK EVERYONE TO CHOOSE FOR INSTANCE THEIR TOP THREE. THEN WHATEVER THREE QUESTIONS GET THE MOST VOTES WOULD BE THE QUESTIONS PLACED ON THE APPLICATION. EVERYBODY WOULD BE ABLE TO REVIEW THOSE ANSWERS IN WRITING BEFORE THE DATE OF THE APPOINTMENT.

ANOTHER ISSUE IS HOW THE BOARD CHOOSES TO VOTE FOR THE CANDIDATE. IF THE BOARD IS GOING TO CHOOSE TO HAVE AN UNLIMITED NUMBER OF FORCED CHOICE ROLL CALL VOTES AND BECAUSE THERE ARE SIX MEMBERS IF YOU CANNOT REACH A DECISION ON THE CANDIDATE, YOU CAN ADJOURN BRIEFLY, CAUCUS, COME BACK AND DECIDE WHETHER OR NOT YOU WANT TO CONTINUE VOTING IN THAT MANNER OR IF YOU WANT TO SWITCH OVER TO RANKED CHOICE VOTING OR IF YOU WANT TO CALL THE VOTE AND DECLARE THAT YOU'RE INCAPABLE OF NOTING A CANDIDATE. IF THAT IS THE CASE THEN THIS MATTER

WOULD HAVE TO GO TO A SPECIAL ELECTION AT THE GENERAL ELECTION IN NOVEMBER. THE PERSON THAT WOULD BE REPLACING THE CURRENT VACANCY WOULD BE THERE FROM THE DATE OF CERTIFICATION OF THE VOTE IN NOVEMBER UNTIL DECEMBER 31ST. THEN THE PERSON WHO WAS ELECTED ON THE REGULAR GENERAL BALLOT WOULD TAKE THEIR POSITION AT THE BEGINNING OF JANUARY.

COMM. HEREK:

WOULD YOU EXPLAIN THE NOVEMBER ELECTION AGAIN.

MS. JOHNSON:

IF THIS BOARD IS UNABLE TO APPOINT SOMEONE WITHIN 30 DAYS, THEN THE MATTER HAS TO GO TO A SPECIAL ELECTION. AT THAT POINT IN TIME THE EARLIEST SPECIAL ELECTION THAT WE WOULD BE ABLE TO COORDINATE FROM THE CLERK'S OFFICE WOULD BE THE NOVEMBER ELECTION-WHERE WE ARE HAVING OUR GENERAL ELECTION.
