Background:

As required by MCL 48.40a, the County Treasurer Shall provide a bond in an amount of at least \$1,000,000 for the faithful and proper discharge of the duties of the County Treasurer's office. The cost of the individual bond shall be paid from the General Fund of the County.

A public official bond for \$1,000,000 with Michigan Municipal Management Authority covering myself for the benefit of the Bay County has been in place since June 15, 2022, the day I took office. I have verified with the Bay County Risk Management that this bond is currently in effect and is expected to remain in effect throughout 2025.

Financial Impact:

There is no additional cost to the County. The bond in place meets the legal requirements.

BY: BAY COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS (1/21/25)

 WHEREAS, On May 2, 2023, the Bay County Board of Commissioners approved Resolution No. 2023-73, allocating \$350,000 of ARPA Revenue Recovery dollars to Bangor Township to serve as a portion of the local match for the Kawkawlin River Flood Management dredging project with the United States Corps of Engineers; and
 WHEREAS, Bangor Township will act as the designated fiduciary of this project; and

- WHEREAS, To enter into the Agreement, the Bay County Board of Commissioners will need to authorize the Bay County Road Commission, pursuant to MCL 324.33701, to enter into an intergovernmental agreement with Bangor Township to contract with the Federal Army Corp of Engineers or any agency of the federal government, whereby, the federal government of agency will pay 50% of the cost and will perform the whole of the work connected with the dredging of the mouth of the Kawkawlin River which has been described to the County by the Army Corp of Engineers as a flood control or drainage control project, with said agreements/contracts to contain specific terms including, but not limited to, the holding and saving of the United States free from damages due to the construction works, required by the act of Congress or Federal regulations as a condition for participation on the part of the federal government; Therefore Be It
- RESOLVED That the Bay County Board of Commissioners authorizes the Bay County Road Commission to enter into an Intergovernmental Agreement with Bangor Township on behalf of Bay County to contract with the Federal Army Corp of Engineers or any agency of the federal government whereby the federal government of agency will pay 50% of the cost and will perform the whole of the work connected with the dredging of the mouth of the Kawkawlin River; Be It Further
- RESOLVED That the Chairman of the Board is authorized to execute an Agreement with the Bay County Road Commission that the Bay County Road Commission shall enter into the aforementioned Intergovernmental Agreement on behalf of Bay County following Corporation Counsel review and approval; the Board authorizes the transfer of the \$350,000 to the Bay County Road Commission for such purposes; Be It Finally

Background:

Since implementation of the Affordable Care Act, Bay County Commissioners have consistently been afforded the option of Health Insurance as a fringe benefit for serving as an elected official on the Board. THE PLANT THAT WAS CONSTRUCTED IN 2015 IS THE LARGEST MEMBRANE PLANT IN THE STATE OF MICHIGAN. IT WORKS VERY WELL BUT WE DON'T HAVE ENOUGH STORED WATER ON SITE IF WE HAVE A PROBLEM WITH OUR PLANT. WE'RE GOING TO RUN DRY IN AS SHORT AS SIX HOURS. OUR GOAL IS TO CONSTRUCT TWO NEW CONCRETE WATER TANKS THAT WILL GIVE US AT LEAST 24 HOURS. IF THERE ARE ANY PROBLEMS OUR STAFF WILL FIX THEM SO WE CAN STAY RUNNING. OUR FINANCIAL ADVISOR, ANDY CAMPBELL IS HERE TO ANSWER ANY QUESTIONS ABOUT THE BONDING PROCESS.
- COMM. BANASZAK: COULD YOU EXPLAIN WHERE THE MONEY IS COMING FROM AND HOW IT'S GOING TO AFFECT THE RESIDENTS?
- MR. GOEBEL: WE HAVE A TRANSMISSION SYSTEM FUND THAT EVERY RESIDENT PAYS. NEXT YEAR RESIDENTS WILL PAY \$.74/750 GALLONS OF WATER. THIS WAS SET UP TO BE A CAPITAL PROJECT FUND.
