WHEREAS, The Child Care Fund from the State of Michigan provides a 50% match for expenditures involving the placement of neglect and abused children in child placement agencies and foster homes; the placement of delinquent youth in the juvenile home facility or institutions for delinquent youth; and programs aimed at working with delinquent youth while the youth remain in their own homes; and

WHEREAS, Each state fiscal year a budget is submitted to the state requesting a specific amount of funding for the year beginning October and ending in September, however, occasionally, the amount the county and the court request from the state does not meet the need as is the case as the current fiscal year is coming to an end; and

WHEREAS, The Bay County Probate Judge is requesting an amendment to this year's County Child Care Budget in the amount of \$100,000.00 to the Family Foster Care line item, with 50% of all monies spent being reimbursed by the State back to the County; Therefore Be It

RESOLVED That the Bay County Board of Commissioners approves the amended County Child Care Budget Summary for FY 10/1/14 through 9/30/15 reflecting the increased funding and authorizes the Chairman of the Board to execute, and submit electronically (if required), the required on behalf of Bay County following legal review/approval; Be It Further

- WHEREAS, The majority of Friend of the Court revenue is derived from the Office of Child Support, a division of the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services (DHS, f/k/a FIA, f/k/a DSS), under the Cooperative Reimbursement Program; and
- WHEREAS, The state will reimburse the county for costs associated with establishing, collecting, and enforcing child support obligations in IV-D cases; and
- WHEREAS, The CRP grant assists the Friend of the Court in performing its "IV-D functions" of collecting, distributing and enforcing court ordered child support obligations, which in turn contributes to the well being of children under the jurisdiction of Bay County Circuit Court. Bay County Friend of the Court currently has approximately 8,000 active child support cases; and
- WHEREAS, The Friend of the Court has received for FY 2013 Title IV-D Cooperative Reimbursement Program Contract the amount of \$1,190,635.00; for FY 2014 the amount of \$1,261,132; for year 2015 the anticipated amount of \$1,341,117.00. FY 2016's Cooperative Reimbursement Program Contract allocation is anticipated to be \$1,335,432.25; Therefore, Be It

- BY: WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE (8/4/15)
- WHEREAS, The following grants support the activities of the Transportation Planning Division which maintains a certified planning program according to federal regulations. The Bay City Area Transportation Study (BCATS) activities are provided in the proposed 2016 Unified Work Program; and
- WHEREAS, The BCATS funded program is required in order to utilize federal funds for road construction projects in the Bay City Urbanized Area. Annual (FY-2016) Project Authorization for the Utilization of Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) Planning Funds (PL) passed through to Bay County (BCATS) by the Michigan Department of Transportation are used to fund the planning activities of the BCATS staff. PL funds are also used for transit planning activities which are passed through Bay County to Bay Metropolitan Transportation Authority (BMTA); and
- WHEREAS, Annual (FY-2016) Asset Management Funds which are used specifically for the required annual Asset Management performed on federal aid roads within Bay County. These funds are utilized by BCATS, the Bay County Road Commission, the City of Bay City, and the City of Essexville for staff time of these agencies spent completing PASER ratings on Federal Aid Roads (a state statutory requirement); and
- WHEREAS, The anticipated 2016 federal funding amounts for each program area are as follows: BCATS PL federal funding amount \$150,720; BMTA PL federal funding amount \$56,816 and; Asset Management funding amount \$20,000.00. Local match is provided through cash contributions from the City of Bay City, City of Essexville, Bay County Road Commission, and Bay Metropolitan Transportation Authority which are then allowable reimbursements to these agencies through the course of the UWP activities. Bay County indirect costs are included and are part of the covered expenses of this grant; Therefore, Be It
- RESOLVED That the Bay County Board of Commissioners approves the Project Authorizations and authorizes the Chairman of the Board, on behalf of Bay County, to execute said forms and all contracts and documents required to implement the BCATS 2016 Unified Work Program following legal review/approval; Be It Further
- RESOLVED That budget adjustments required related to the BCATS 2016 Unified Work Program are approved.

WHEREAS, An issue arose regarding employees purchasing "other governmental service credit ("OGSC") for retirement" and whether the purchase of that OGSC creates an unfunded liability in the Bay County Employees' Retirement System ("BCERS"); and

WHEREAS, In the past, BCERS' Retirement Administrator calculated the cost for the purchase of OGSC utilizing a standard formula set forth in MCL 46.12a(9)(d), which was also adopted as the appropriate formula by the Bay County Board of Commissioners in Resolution 96-331. Indeed, this is the only formula that may be utilized by BCERS if the County wished to provide this discretionary benefit to members of BCERS. It has historically been assumed that the computed cost of buying time pursuant to the statutory calculation is the actual cost to the Retirement System; and

WHEREAS, After a recent request by an employee to purchase OGSC an actuarial valuation was completed and it was determined that the true cost to BCERS was much more than the statutory calculation allowed, thereby creating an unfunded actuarial liability; and

WHEREAS, It is in the best interest of the County, as well as the members of BCERS, to eliminate unfunded actuarial liabilities; and

WHEREAS, In the interest of fairness to current eligible employees and to discontinue the indefinite accrual of unfunded actuarial liabilities to BCERS, the Board of Commissioners rescinded Resolution 96-331, effective 5:00 P.M., June 12, 2015, and created a temporary 30-day "window," or opportunity, for eligible employees to apply to purchase OGSC toward retirement under Resolution 96-331 before its rescission. This allowed current eligible employees to submit a completed application to purchase OGSC to the Retirement Administrator before 5:00 p.m. on June 12, 2015. Employees who submitted applications during that 30-day window may proceed to request the purchase of OGSC pursuant to the procedures set forth in Resolution 96-331, including the requirement that, if the request is granted by the Board, the employee must pay the full amount due to purchase OGSC within a period of one (1) year; and

WHEREAS, After 5:00 p.m. on June 12, 2015, no further applications to purchase OGSC were accepted; and

 WHEREAS, Many waterfront communities were built around their water resources years ago, and are now working to reposition and overcome issues such as limited public access and poor alignment with modern development. In addition to adapting to economic shifts, waterfront communities are facing pressures to meet increasing demands on water resources, make resilient investments that can withstand weather extremes like storms, floods, and fluctuating lake levels, and adapt to changing ecosystem conditions from shoreline erosion to stresses on fisheries; and
 WHEREAS, Waterfront planning and implementation requires communities to navigate intergovernmental hurdles, work across constituent groups and agencies, and secure financing, however, many communities lack such resources – despite that this type of preparation can save money long term; and
 WHEREAS, This bill will support community efforts to make the most of water resources by attracting water-dependent industries and investments that leverage water sustainability, revitalize neighborhoods, and allow for recreation and tourism; and
 WHEREAS, The bill will support communities to plan for their future, provide the tools to implement that plan, and help them attract private and non-profit investment by:

1. Creating a voluntary Resilient Waterfront Community designation within the Department of Commerce. The designation recognizes communities that adopt a waterfront revitalization and resiliency plan integrating economic, ecosystem, & infrastructure challenges and opportunities.
2. Creating a Grant Program providing funding to develop and implement a Resilient Waterfront Community plan. Grants could be used to advance various projects, such as:
 - a. Improving waterfront access or acquiring easements from developers for public amenities
 - b. Making infrastructure upgrades that improve coastal resiliency
3. Establishing a Resilient Waterfront Communities network to support sharing of best practices.
4. Establishing preferred status in other federal grant and loan programs for Resilient Waterfront Communities. Reinvestment and resiliency can reduce long-term costs to taxpayers and spur economic growth. This bill would help projects in Resilient Waterfront Communities move forward more quickly and help maximize the value of federal investments in these communities; and

WHEREAS, Bay County has been and continues to be committed to revitalization of its waterfronts and this legislation will play a key role in those efforts; Therefore, Be It
