
County Board of Commissioners meets in equalization session. MCL 209.5(1) and 211.34(1)

MCL 209.5(1): At the regular meeting of the boards of commissioners of the several counties held on the Tuesday following the second Monday in April each year, the boards of commissioners shall equalize the assessment rolls in the manner provided by law. The equalization shall be completed before the first Monday in May.

MCL 211.34(1): The county board of commissioners in each county shall meet in April each year to determine county equalized value which equalization shall be completed and submitted along with the tabular statement required by section 5 of Act No. 44 of the Public Acts of 1911, being section 209.5 of the Michigan Compiled Laws, to the State Tax Commission before the first Monday in May.



WHEREAS,	Public Act 261 of 1966 promulgated that the length of terms for the new county commissioners shall be concurrent with that of state representatives, as specified in Article IV, section 3 of the Michigan Constitution; and
WHEREAS,	The scope of duties of a county commissioner has greatly increased in the last century - road patrols, indigent defense, mental health treatment and substance abuse prevention programming, solid waste pick-up and disposal, food and water supply safety, park operations, economic development efforts, emergency management and response; and
WHEREAS,	Michigan is one of only five states in the United States that provides for exclusively two-year terms for county commissioners; and
WHEREAS,	All other county and township elected officials in Michigan are elected to terms of at least four years; and
WHEREAS,	The position of county commissioner is a highly complex oversight role that requires years to master; and
WHEREAS,	Legislation to amend state law to enact four-year terms has been filed in the form of Senate Bills 242 and 245; and
WHEREAS,	The Michigan Association of Counties supports the legislation as introduced; Therefore, Be It
RESOLVED	That the Bay County Board of Commissioners supports Senate Bills 242 and 245 to enact four-year terms for county commissioners; Be It Further

WHEREAS,	The Bay County Executive has reached out to the various municipalities and boards in Bay County that would be affected by the expiration of the remote attendance option under the Open Meetings Act requesting feedback as to whether there was a need to extend the remote option based on the limited space in some municipalities to accommodate any significant number of attendees at scheduled public mee; and
WHEREAS,	The majority of public boards and municipalities contacted indicated that they would like the option to conduct virtual public meetings to be extended in order to protect the public, staff and other attendees at public meetings where capacity is unknown or unable to be controlled; and
WHEREAS,	As a result of this feedback, as well as discussions with the County's Public Health Officer relating to the need to protect the public, attendees and staff, on April 6, 2021, the Bay County Executive declared a Local State of Emergency to allow the option of continued use of virtual public meetings for open meetings that take place in Bay County; and
WHEREAS,	That declaration was made pursuant to the authority found in the Emergency Management Act, MCL 30.401, 1976 PA 390, as amended, and Section three (3) of the Open Meetings Act. Pursuant to the Emergency Management Act, this Board must vote to continue my Local State of Emergency Order after seven (7) days, or no later than April 13, 2021; and
