WHEREAS,	These programs assist in lowering prison commitments, allow for pre-trial supervision services and provide valuable drug treatment and educational services; and
WHEREAS,	Routinely, the Office of Community Corrections contracts with SMB Program d/b/a TRI-CAP, INC., Sacred Heart Rehabilitation Center d/b/a BASIS and Education Training Connection as the provider for these services; and
WHEREAS,	Pursuant to Resolution 2023-52, the Bay County Community Corrections was awarded \$166,264 for the 2024 Michigan Department of Corrections Grant Program to contract the service providers; and
WHEREAS,	Pursuant to Resolution 2023-106, a Memorandum of Understanding for the Ethics in Parenting Program(new for 2024) between Bay County Community Corrections, Dr. Kirk Wolf and the Bay County Sheriff's Office was approved and executed; and
WHEREAS,	The Bay County Community Corrections is seeking authorization to enter into the following service agreements with the service providers: (1) Non-Core Service and OMSP Inpatient Agreement with SMB Probation Center: (2) Substance Abuse Evaluations Agreement with Sacred Heart: (3) Outpatient Substance Abuse Treatment Agreement with Sacred Heart; (4) Agreement for Education/Restaurant Ready Services provided by Education Training Connections; and (5) MOU for Ethics in Parenting with Dr. Kirk Wolf; and
WHEREAS,	The above service contracts are entirely paid for through grant funding and no service contracts will be entered into unless the grant funding is awarded to Bay County. The Service contracts provide for contract termination if there is no available grant funding. There is no financial impact to Bay County; Therefore, Be It

WHEREAS,	In the past, the Bay County Sheriff's Office was able to utilize, at no charge, Business Watch International (BWI)'s law enforcement property recovery search system which allows law enforcement to search daily entries from local pawnshops and second-hand dealers to search for stolen items; and
WHEREAS,	BWI was purchased by LeadsOnline and the service is no longer free. Accordingly, the Bay County Sheriff's Office received a proposal from LeadsOnline; and
WHEREAS,	LeadsOnline provides a quick and comprehensive way for law enforcement to run case information through its search system and allows law enforcement to instantly search transactions from reporting pawnshops to identify people, property, and patterns; and
WHEREAS,	Based on the LeadsOnline proposal, the cost of the Power Plus search system is \$3,236 a year for a three (3) year term with an annual increase capped at 3% per year; and
WHEREAS,	Bay County Ordinances 51 and 52 require pawnbrokers in Bay County to have a Dealer License, which is approximately \$200 per license per year. Bay County receives approximately \$400 a year for these pawnbroker's licenses; and
WHEREAS,	If permissible under state law, the Bay County Ordinance could be amended to increase the application fee and these potential additional funds may be used to cover a portion of the property recovery search system costs; and

The Bay County Sheriff is requesting a budget adjustment of up to \$4,000 to cover the costs WHEREAS, of the LeadsOnline property recovery search system contract; Therefore, Be It

That the Bay County Board of Commissioners approves a contract with LeadsOnline and Bay County (Sheriff's Office) with a budget adjustment of up to \$4,000; Be It Further

The Bay County Board of Commissioners has the duty, in its October annual session, to do the following in accordance with 211.37 of the Michigan Property Tax Laws; and

WHEREAS,

These requirements are as follows:

Sec. 37: The County Board of Commissioners, at its annual session in October in each year, shall ascertain and determine the amount of money to be raised for County purposes, which determination and apportionment shall be entered at large It shall also examine all certificates, statements, papers, and records submitted to it, showing the moneys to be raised in the several townships for school, highway, drain, township and other purposes. It shall hear and duly consider all objections made to raising any such moneys by any taxpayer to be affected thereto. If it shall appear to the Board that any certificate, statement, paper, or record is not properly certified, or that the same is in anyway defective, or that any proceeding to authorize the raising of any such moneys had not been had or is in anyway imperfect, the Board shall certify the same, and if the certificate, statement, paper, record, or proceeding can then be corrected, supplied or had, the Board shall authorize and require the defects or omissions of proceedings to be corrected, supplied, or had. It may refer any or all the certificates, statements, papers, records, and proceedings to the Prosecuting Attorney, whose duty it shall be to examine the same and without delay, report in writing his opinion to the Board. It shall direct that such of the several amounts of money proposed to be raised for township, school, highway, drain, and all other purposes as shall be authorized by law, be spread upon the assessment roll of the proper townships, wards and cities. Such action and direction shall be entered in full upon the records of the proceedings of the Board and shall be final as to the levy and assessment of all such taxes, except when there is a change made in the equalization of any county by the Board or State Tax Commission upon appeal in the manner provided by law. The direction for spread of taxes shall be expressed in terms of millages to be spread against the taxable values of properties and shall not direct the raising of any specific amount of money. This section does not apply when Section 36(2) applies; and

WHEREAS,

The Bay County Board of Commissioners has caused the above to be thoroughly checked for statutory requirements; Therefore, Be It
