WHEREAS,	The Michigan Department of Environment, Great Lakes, and Energy (EGLE) is accepting applications for Scrap Tire Cleanup Grants for FY 2024 with an application deadline of September 29, 2023; and
WHEREAS,	The scrap tire recycling collection allows residents to dispose of up to 10 rimless, passenger car-sized tires which reduces the number of potential breeding sites for mosquitoes as well as aesthetically improves the landscape; and
WHEREAS,	Since receiving its first grant in 2013, Mosquito Control has been awarded \$73,600 in Scrap Tire Cleanup Grants and removed over 25,000 scrap tires from the Bay County landscape; and
WHEREAS,	Entities are eligible to receive up to \$3,000 per trailer for a resident drop-off cleanup day such as the scrap tire collections held by Mosquito Control; and
WHEREAS,	Bay County Mosquito Control holds two scrap tire collections each summer, utilizing up to two trailers per tire drive, therefore is requesting to apply for \$12,000. No matching funds are necessary and no money would be required to apply for the grant; Therefore, Be It
RESOLVED	That the Bay County Board of Commissioners authorizes submittal and acceptance of the EGLE Scrap Tire Cleanup Grant for FY 2024 in the amount of \$12,000, and the Chairman of the Board is authorized to execute grant application and award documents on behalf of Bay County (Mosquito Control) following Corporation Counsel review and approval; Be It Further

WHEREAS,

The Bay City Area Transportation Study (BCATS) serves as the federally certified transportation planning organization in the urbanized area of Bay County, Michigan. BCATS is led by Bay County (Transpiration Planning) and is comprised of local road agency representation from the Bay County Road Commission, City of Bay City, City of Essexville, Bay Metropolitan Transit Authority (Bay Metro) and the townships of Bangor, Frankenlust, Hampton, Kawkawlin, Monitor and Portsmouth; and

WHEREAS,

BCATS does the critical transportation planning necessary to identify transportation needs for public transit, access management studies, and roadway improvement planning and prioritizes road improvement projects throughout Bay County. These priority work elements are presented in the federal required annual 2024 Unified Work Program (UWP); and

WHEREAS,

Both the MDOT and FHWA provide annual transportation planning funding to support BCATS as the Municipal Planning Organization (MPO) necessary to develop the UWP. This funding for BCATS is provided through annual Project Authorizations (PA) which serve as official contracts between BCATS and MDOT, FHWA and FTA; and

WHEREAS,

As in the past years, the PA allows reimbursement for planning-related activities and requires approval from the Bay County Board of Commissioners in order to utilize federal funds for road construction projects in the Bay County urbanized area; and

WHEREAS,

Federal Highway Administration grant funds are passed through MDOT and used to support the activities of the Bay County Transportation Planning program. FHWA PL funds are also used for transit planning activities which are passed through Bay County to Bay Metro Transit Authority, which requires a subcontract between BCATS and BMTA that allows BMTA to bill MDOT for planning funds; and

WHEREAS,

The anticipated 2024 federal funding amounts for each program area are BCATS PL federal funding \$205,355; BMTA PL federal funding - \$52,382; and Asset Management funding - \$19,900. Local match is provided through cash contributions from the City of Bay City, City of Essexville, Bay County Road Commission, and Bay Metro Transit Authority, which are then allowable reimbursements to the agencies through the course of the UWP activities. Bay County's indirect costs are included and are part of the covered expenses from this federal funding; Therefore, Be it

WHEREAS,	With NMS providing the bulk of forensic toxicology services in the eastern half of the United States, results from said testing usually take 2-4 months to complete thus delaying finalized autopsy reports; and
WHEREAS,	Additionally, NMS assigns billing to the Medical Examiner by name and not geographic or political location and in several instances, Bay County has been erroneously billed for services rendered by Dr. Morrone in neighboring counties; and
WHEREAS,	The Medical Examiner entered into an Agreement with Axis Toxicology Services, Inc. as it provides an established and reliable array of toxicology services with a turnaround rate of completion in days/weeks and not months; and
WHEREAS,	The per unit rate for a blood panel is approximately \$34 higher than NMS, but the turnaround as described is significantly shorter resulting in greater efficiency. It is not expected that the change will result in significantly increased costs and it is anticipated that the current budgeted funds should be sufficient for the current year; Therefore, Be It
