
Rober Mead's skills and experience make him a perfect choice for the Bay County Building Authority. He is willing and able to step immediately and serve his role.

WHEREAS,	The Bay County Health Department has successfully partnered with My Community Dental Centers (MCDC) in opening and operating a dental clinic for the underserved in Bay County since 2019; and
WHEREAS,	Via a 2005 Medicaid State Plan Amendment – public dental clinics operated by or on behalf of local Health Departments are able to receive an enhanced Federal Medicaid rate – which allows for higher reimbursement than traditional state Medicaid and for the sustainability of the clinics, coupled with technology and innovation; and
WHEREAS,	Enhanced Federal reimbursement is received quarterly via an Intergovernmental Transfer (IGT) Process with the Health Department/County, the State of Michigan and MCDC; and
WHEREAS,	In order to continue the success of the dental clinic, the Health Department is requesting to renew Agreements, which are set to expire on September 30, 2024, with MCDC, so they may continue to operate a public dental clinic within the guidelines stated; and
WHEREAS,	In addition, the Health Department is requesting to continue the agreements to provide Kindergarten Oral Health Assessments with MCDC as it has done since 2022. These assessments must be performed by a licensed dental hygienist or dentist; and
WHEREAS,	There are no financial considerations at this time. Currently, the State of Michigan is providing the required matching funds to allow enhanced reimbursement for Medicaid adults; and

WHEREAS, The renewal of the agreement with MCDC to continue to provide dental assessment services to eligible children in Kindergarten is expected to total \$85,513 per year; Therefore, Be It

RESOLVED That the Bay County Board of Commissioners approves renewal of the Agreements between My Community Dental Centers (MCDC) and Bay County (Health Department) and authorizes the Board Chair to sign the Agreements and any related documents following Corporation Counsel review and approval; Be It Finally

REQUEST:

For this item to be placed on the Committee of the Whole agenda for October 8th, 2024 and for the Board Authorization for the Chairperson of the Board to sign all related documentation and/or contracts pertaining to the Federal Access and Visitation Grant for the Bay County Friend of the Court.

BACKGROUND:

The State Court Administrative Office (SCAO) is the administrative agency of the Michigan Supreme Court and is responsible for administering the Federal Access and Visitation Grants to courts for the provision of direct services that increase non-custodial parents' access to and visitation with their children.

SCAO is contracting with the Bay County Friend of the Court for the provisions of direct services that support and facilitate non-custodial parents' access to and visitation with their children. The direct Service Provider Agency for the Bay County Friend of the Court is Wellspring Lutheran Services Wellspring Lutheran Services will provide supervised parenting time based on Court Order referrals from the Friend of the Court office. Supervised (including monitored and therapeutic) parenting time is eligible for reimbursement under this Agreement.

FINANCE:

The total Access and Visitation funding available FY 2025, to the Bay County Friend of the Court is \$1000.00. FY 2024, the allocation was \$1100.00, which demonstrates a decrease in the FY 2025 of \$100.00. This number is based upon the available budget by the State of Michigan.

RECOMMENDATION:

The Friend of the Court requests the Board of Commissioners authorize the Chairperson of the Board to sign all related documentation and / or contracts pertaining to the Federal Access and Visitation Grand after review by the Corporation Counsel.

Attached you will find the County At-large Assessments for drain projects this year. The total is \$119,804.76. We continue to attempt to minimize the County At-Large Assessments in an effort to reduce the burden on the general fund but have been very active in our work.

I must note that most assessments, however, are "Operation and Maintenance". Under the Drain Code, these project figures are determined by the "historical percentages" set by the last petitioned project for that particular drain. Our ability to alter these is very limited.

As you will note from the list, we have had a productive year in upgrading the County's drain system. We attempted to address the many requests we received during the last year. We have taken advantage of our internal staff, good pricing from contractors and close working relationships with townships to complete the work affordably as possible. It reflects the skill and hard work of the staff we have in the Office of the Drain Commissioner.

I am aware of the difficult job you have with respect to the County budget and wanted to assure you our office is doing what it can to reduce our burden on it. Please do not hesitate to contact me with questions.

It shall direct that such of the several amounts of money proposed to be raised for township, school, highway, drain, and all other purposes as shall be authorized by law, be spread upon the assessment roll of the proper townships, wards and cities. Such action and direction shall be entered in full upon the records of the proceedings of the Board and shall be final as to the levy and assessment of all such taxes, except when there is a change made in the equalization of any county by the Board or State Tax Commission upon appeal in the manner provided by law. direction for spread of taxes shall be expressed in terms of millages to be spread against the taxable values of properties and shall not direct the raising of any specific amount of money. This section does not apply when Section 36(2) applies; and

MR. PINTER:

WE DON'T USUALLY COPY THE COUNTY ON FINANCIAL STUFF BUT I AM HERE TO GIVE YOU AN UPDATE. ESSENTIALLY, THE STRUGGLE FOR THE LAST COUPLE OF YEARS HAS BEEN OUR RELATIONSHIP WITH THE STATE WHICH HAS BEEN STRAINED WHEN IT COMES TO MENTAL HEALTH POLICY EVER SINCE COVID AND COVID ENDED, THEY TREAT US LIKE WE'RE A COMMERCIAL VENDOR. AS WE'VE BEEN DEALING WITH THE DEPARTMENT THIS YEAR, THEY'VE UNDERFUNDED THE SYSTEM OVER \$100,000,000 SHORT OF THE APPROPRIATION THAT WAS APPROVED IN LAST YEAR'S BUDGET. AND WE'VE BEEN ASKING THEM TO JUST PUSH THAT MONEY OUT BEFORE THE END OF THE YEAR. IT'S BEEN ONE OF THOSE THINGS THAT'S BEEN FRUSTRATING BECAUSE THE MONEY'S THERE, THE LEGISLATURE APPROPRIATED IT AND WAS ASSIGNED AND APPROVED BY THE GOVERNOR. WE HAVE DEMONSTRATED THAT SIX OF THE TEN REGIONS THAT THEY DIVIDED US INTO TWO YEARS AGO ARE RUNNING INTO A DEFICIT THIS YEAR ON MEDICAID. EIGHT OF THE TWELVE CMH'S IN OUR TWENTY-ONE COUNTY REGION ARE RUNNING A DEFICIT. I'VE SEEN MY INPATIENT, MY CLS AND MY AUTISM SERVICES GO UP FORTY PERCENT IN THE LAST THREE YEARS. I'VE SEEN MY COST OF LABOR AS THE COUNTY HAS, COST OF HEALTHCARE, MEDICAL INFLATION HAS RISEN SEVENTEEN PERCENT IN THREE YEARS AND OUR RATES HAVE BEEN ADJUSTED ABOUT SIX PERCENT OVER PERIOD. WHAT'S FRUSTRATING SAME APPROPRIATED ENOUGH MONEY TO COVER US FOR THIS YEAR, THE DEPARTMENT'S JUST NOT PUSHING IT OUT. IN THIS CASE, THE MONEY IS SITTING IN THE TREASURY. IN THIS LETTER, I WANTED THE COMMISSION TO KNOW WHY THIS WAS HAPPENING AND WHY WE WERE GETTING CONCERNED BECAUSE, AT THE END OF THE DAY, THIS IS STILL A STATE AND COUNTY PARTNERSHIP. IT'S A GOVERNMENT-TO-GOVERNMENT PARTNERSHIP BETWEEN THE MENTAL HEALTH AUTHORITY AND THE CMH. IF THEY ARE NOT GOING TO ADEQUATELY FUND THE SYSTEM, THEY'RE WALKING AWAY FROM THEIR PARTNERSHIP WITH THE COUNTY, ESPECIALLY IF THE MONEY'S ALREADY BEEN APPROPRIATED. I THINK IT'S MORE IMPORTANT THAT WE FOCUS ON WHETHER WE CAN GET THIS RESOLVED. I THINK WE'RE GOING TO HAVE THE SAME PROBLEM IN 2025, I'M CONCERNED THAT EVERY YEAR THIS IS GOING TO BE THE STANDARD PRACTICE NOW THAT MONEY MIGHT BE APPROPRIATED, WHICH DOESN'T DO OUR PEOPLE ANY GOOD. WE CAN RUN UP SERVICES, WE CAN RUN UP DEFICIT, WE CAN GO GET A LINE OF CREDIT. IF THE MONEY'S ALREADY THERE AND THESE PUBLIC SERVICES ARE NECESSARY, THEY SHOULD FUND THEM. IT'S BEEN REAL FRUSTRATING FOR US.
