

VOTE ABSENTEE BY MAIL OR DROP-OFF

Any registered voter may vote by absentee ballot using a 2 step process.

- 1. A voter must submit an absentee ballot application before an absentee ballot can be sent. Once your local clerk receives your completed application, they will mail out an absentee ballot.
- 2. Return your ballot by mail or in-person to your local clerk's office. You can also drop voted absentee ballots into your township or city ballot drop box.

Permanent Absentee Ballot **Application**

Voters who want to automatically receive a ballot for all future elections may sign up for the Permanent Ballot List anytime at mi.gov/vote or when submitting an Absent Voter Ballot Application.

This option may not be ideal for all voters. Voter is responsible for updating any temporary mailing address with your local clerk's office. Ballots cannot be forwarded by the post office.




VOTE EARLY IN-PERSON

LOCATION - Bay County Community Center 800 JFK Dr. Bay City, MI 48706

<u>TIME</u> - 8:30 a.m. - 4:30 p.m.

DAYS - Begins the second Saturday prior to Election Day and ends the Sunday before an election.





VOTE ON ELECTION DAY IN-PERSON

• Polls are open 7:00 a.m. - 8:00 p.m. • Contact your local clerk for your polling location or check <u>mi.gov/vote</u> • Voted absentee ballots can be returned and tabulated at your election day precinct.

<u>Need assistance marking your ballot?</u>

Ask the election inspectors at your precinct to use the Voter Assist Terminal to help mark your ballot.

Voter Registration

• Those who have a valid Michigan Driver's License or State ID, can register at mi.gov/vote • Register by mail or in-person at the clerk's office

Deadlines

• Online or by mail: up to 15 days before an election. • In-person at your local clerk's office: through election day. Proof of residency required during last 14 days before election day.
